## Good to know tips



#### INTERNATIONAL AIR TRAVEL

The Maldives has 3 international airports, with the main one being Velana International Airport located in Hulhule island, connected via bridge to the capital, Male City, and modern metropolis, Hulhumale. Over 30 international airlines fly to the Maldives at regular intervals.



#### FERRY NETWORK, DHONIS & SPEEDBOATS

Regular ferries, dhonis, (boats) and speedboats help make travel between islands and atolls that much easier. These trips are cost-efficient, but take longer than seaplane trips, but are certainly the most convenient ways to travel for personal itineraries. Plus, speedboat rides can be as exhilarating as any adventure activity on the sea.



#### **SEAPLANE**

The Maldives is home to the largest fleet of seaplanes in the world, not surprising given the natural geography of our scattered islands. Seaplanes travel from all international airports to convenient locations near islands and island resorts, for ease of travel and some of the most breathtaking views you can imagine. Don't forget your camera, you will regret it.



#### **COVID GUIDELINES**

As of March 2022, the Maldives no longer require visitors to present a negative Covid-19 PCR test on arrival or prior to departure from the nation. However, visitors are required to present confirmation of having received their Covid-19 vaccination doses at least fourteen (14) days prior to their arrival to the Maldives.



#### FREE VISA ON ARRIVAL

All visitors of all nationalities are welcome to the Maldives, with a free 30-day tourist visa provided to all visitors on arrival to the Maldives.



#### DRESS CODES AND BIKINI BEACHES

All visitors to local islands are requested to adhere to modest dress codes while on inhabited islands. However, there are specially designated Bikini Beaches in most popular guesthouse islands in the Maldives, so don't despair, you can still easily get your tan on without disruptions. There are no such dress code requirements aboard liveaboards or in island resorts.



#### LANGUAGE AND CURRENCY

The local language of the Maldives in Dhivehi, an indo-aryan language. However, you will find that almost every Maldivian is tri-lingual and speaks clear english along with one other language too, ranging from south asia to eastern european languages. It's always a good idea to inquire with your property beforehand if you would like someone who speaks your native language to assist you.

Similarly, while our local currency is known as Maldivian Rufiyaa, almost every establishment in the Maldives will be happy to accept United States Dollars or Euros. Exchange rates for MVR to USD are fixed at MVR 15,42 for 1 USD.

There are several conveniently located money changing facilities too, located throughout inhabited islands. Currency exchange services are also available from the reception of your chosen property.



#### ALCOHOL

Contrary to popular belief, the Maldives only has restrictions on the consumption of alcohol on inhabited islands. Visitors will find the wine flowing freely in resorts, liveaboards, and any and all tourist establishments outside of local islands. Visitors staying at local islands are free to take a trip to a moored liveaboard close-by or take an excursion to a resort should they want alcoholic beverages.
